Experimentation of methods developed at the Nonformal Education Laboratory 2013 and exhibition of tools and instruments in working with children and youth

The Laboratory of Nonformal Education is a concept event in which educational experts are invited to teach practitioners about nonformal education methods and how they can apply these methods in their communities and in direct work with their beneficiaries. This year, the event was focused on how to use nonformal education methods in dealing with human rights issues at a general level and on how to combat hate speech through the use of nonformal education methods.

Methods like living library, Photovoice, Forum Theatre were experimented by the participants in order to understand better how they can organize them so that they can tackle the human rights issue in their activities/projects.

The conference session will reproduce a part of this experiment, inviting specialized facilitators to undertake short demos on nonformal education methods and demonstrate their efficiency in combating hate speech.
